I am very pleased to report on behalf of our team that we achieved all of the above and looking for to continuing our collective work in moving this organization to the next level set forth in our vision and mission statements.

Many of you reminded me of the sad reality of previous organizations like LIMANA that were birthed and had to die because of leadership struggles and missed placed priorities. I assured you that by the grace of Almighty God LIMANA will not be one of such organizations. I am confident that God who began this work with us will lead, direct and blessed us with all that we need to succeed, Jesus's Name.
