LIMANA support the following stands which are drawn from Liberia's 1985 Revised Constitution of the Second Republic.

Human right protection and accountability as set forth the United Nations 1945 Universal Human Rights Declaration.

Equal Justice under the Laws of Liberia for all Liberians as mandated in the 1985 Revised Constitution of the Republic of Liberia.

Advancement of Cultural Values True to the African Heritage of Liberia's indigenous and migrated people.

Land Reform Policy and Practices for the Promotion of National Unity given the current reality of conflict in the sale and purchase of land in Liberia.

Liberian Pride at all sectors of Liberian society that must be exemplified by all national leaders.

International Peace and Cooperation with other nations that are consistent with international law and presidents.

Balanced Domestic Opportunity for all Liberians that address the socio-economic divide between the haves and the have-nots.

National Agenda for Sustainable and Development in a decentralized functionary of all the branches of government organs.

Opportunities for individual advancement declared in the Constitution that all people are created equal and ...

Wealth (national) Creating Economic Policy and Practices by enforcing current laws with accountability irrespective of position or connections.

The above statements are consistent with the core biblical mandate for all leaders: "act justly, love mercy and walking humbling before God" (Micah 6:8) of all people and nation committed to the Rule of Law, national stability and prosperity. We put them forward as basic condition of any person or political party interest in public service at any and all levels government.
